- I. Call Meeting to Order Jen Argenta
 - A. Jen Argenta called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

- II. Approval of Minutes from September 9, 2025 ALL
 - A. [9.10.2025 Minutes](#)
 - B. Bethany motioned to approve, and Ms. Kaplan seconded. The minutes are approved as written.

- III. Principals' Reports Dotty Lin, Christine Ritter
 - A. Kings Park
 - 1. Kings Park is designated as an "On Track" with 89.1 points as determined by the VDOE's School Performance and Support Framework.
 - 2. It is Computer Science Week, and an FCPS communications team will be in the building to take pictures,
 - 3. A team of staff members from Kings Park, including the librarian, AART, SBTS, and Special Education chair, won an FCPS Educational Grant. Their grant application was entitled "Spark Your Story" and supports 2E students. There were 258 applications, and 129 grants were awarded.
 - 4. The Thanksgiving luncheon was a great success with 685 guests served.
 - 5. Veteran's Day celebration occurred in November, and Kindergarteners did a great performance.
 - 6. Family engagement opportunities continue including "Open House" specials and Meet You at the Library.
 - 7. Kings Park served as a special election site on 12/9/2025.
 - 8. Staff members engaged in a PD around Multilingual students; there are 25 languages spoken at Kings Park.
 - 9. The Book Fair is underway.
 - B. Kings Glen
 - 1. Kings Glen is designated as an "On Track" with 89.6 points as determined by the VDOE's School Performance and Support Framework.
 - 2. Kings Glen is currently at 4.0 chronic absenteeism, down from 5.0 last year at this time.
 - 3. The Kings Glen community is happy to welcome back Mr. Mason after his deployment with the National Guard.
 - 4. The Thanksgiving luncheon was a success with 250 families purchasing lunch.
 - 5. The Book Fair is underway.
 - A. The inflatable race was a success.
 - B. The Human Growth and Development lessons will occur in 5th grade tomorrow, and next week for 4th and 6th grades.
 - C. The 5th and 6th concert, including chorus, strings and band, will be this week. The 4th grade strings concert is next week.

- B. Vice President, Events Bethany Portock
1. November Family Photos went very well and the indoor location was great!
 2. Summer Camp Informational Fair will be held January 15th from 6-7:30pm at Kings Park. Various local vendors will be in attendance to provide parents with information on summer camps for 2026.
 3. Family Fitness Night will be on February 6th from 6:30-8pm. We will have various local sports/athletic vendors there to provide interactive activities for students and their families.
- C. Vice President, Fundraising Sarah Maccubbin Tremper
1. Fun Run was a great success, and a huge thank you to the community for their support. \$86,000 was raised in profit. The PTA has signed a contract with a similar timeframe for next year.
 2. Spiritwear arrived and was distributed. Orders can continue at any time and be shipped directly to students' homes.
 3. Parent's Nights Out and Restaurant nights will return after the new year.
 4. Kings Park Yearbook Photos are needed. Information on how to upload photos is forthcoming.
- D. Vice President, Education Lisley Anco
1. As part of the Treats for Troops program, over 125 pounds of donated candy was shipped to West Virginia. Having many drop off locations helped parents with flexibility to drop off candy.
 2. Fall afterschool activities are complete.
 3. The hope to start Spring Afterschool Activities the first week in March. A plan to handle volunteers and other requirements is being reviewed and will be presented to the schools in February.
 4. Possible future speakers include a representative to share about 529 plans.
- E. Membership Tracy Haynes
1. We currently have 245 members.
- F. [Treasurer's Report](#) Eric DeTurk
1. The amended budget (linked above) was submitted for approval.
 2. Initial teacher reimbursements have closed, and midyear teacher reimbursements will be available on February 1st.
 3. Team support funds (between 600 to 700 dollars per grade) are available. If teams are able to use them during this school year, this allows the students of the families who donated to be impacted by the funds.
 4. Each of the specials have allocated money for support.
 5. Some teacher start up funds were leftover and were rolled over to next year.
 6. \$10,000 was transferred to the capital campaign to fund the electronic sign before Kings Glen.
 7. An issue on the website prevented teachers from submitting reimbursements; it has been resolved, but please let us know of any issues.
 8. Additional changes include increased funding for Books and Bingo, \$1,200 into student support funds, and \$1,500 for capital campaign.
 9. The goal is to zero out the budget by the end of the school year.
 10. Eric Deturk makes a motion to approve the budget, and Bethany Portock seconded. The motion passed to approve the amended budget as presented.
